

Kitsumkalum Ratification Committee

The Ratification Committee is a tripartite body made up of representatives appointed by Kitsumkalum First Nation, the Government of B.C., and the Government of Canada.

It is an independent body, established under the treaty, to advance one common interest: overseeing a fair voting process.

The Ratification Committee is impartial. It does not act “for” or “against” the treaty. Its responsibilities include:

- Drafting and publishing Rules of Procedure for the vote
- Issuing a Notice of Vote that gives the vote date and location
- Ensuring potential voters have an opportunity to review the Treaty and Constitution
- Creating and publishing a list of eligible voters
- Overseeing the voting process, including the ballot count
- Hiring a Chief Electoral Officer to conduct the vote
- Publishing the results of the vote

Rules of Procedure

The [Rules of Procedure](#) were developed by the Ratification Committee with the Chief Electoral Officer to ensure that the ratification process and the vote are fair and transparent.

- The ballot questions
- Who is eligible to vote
- How to vote (in person, online, by telephone or by mail)
- How to contact the Chief Electoral Officer with questions
